Barbara Nabors aboard Loki and **Melissa Sinopoli** with Legacy traveled to the Ridge Show in Asbury on July 20th. They both rode well with Barbara competing in the Level O Division (2'9") and Melissa showing in the Itty Bitty Division (2'6'). Each division has 3 classes with differing requirements such as time taken the first round or time taken in the jump off. (Riders going clean in the first round, i.e., having no faults will do a timed "jump off". The horse that goes the fastest with no faults is the winner.)

Barbara and Loki earned a first place and two second places to capture the Division Championship. Melissa and Legacy earned two fourths and a fifth.

Barbara and Loki also competed at The Ridge Show on July 27th. Riding in the same division (Level O), they earned two firsts and a fourth place and again won the Championship! Congratulations!

Bucks County Horse Park

Melissa Sinopoli and *Capri Tanis* journeyed over to Bucks County Horse Park to ride in their Friday Evening Schooling Horse Trials on July 27th. It was the first time that Capri and Mariposa competed off the property.

Melissa rode in the Beginner-Novice Division and had a bit of trouble with Legacy being naughty. He was very obedient in Dressage, earning a respectable score of 32.0, but stopped at the "Dice Jump" in show jumping and refused a ramp jump on cross country.

Mariposa proved to be quite courageous. Although she was a bit tense in dressage, she and Capri went clean in Show Jumping and cantered around the cross country. They ended up fourth overall. Congratulations!

Won the Young Rider Team Silver Medal & the Young Rider Individual Bronze Medal at the 2010 North American Youth Competition.

Winner of the 2008 ASPCA Maclay Finals.

Member of the 2018 FEI Jumping Nations Cup Final in Barcelona, Spain.

Member of the 2020 FEI Jumping Nations Cup USA Team. Member of the 2021FEI Jumping Nations Cup Wellington Team .
